communication: a means of sending and receiving information; may be words or other style

comprehension: the understanding and interpretation of what is read

genre: a category of writing style or artistic composition, such as poetry, fiction, or portrait

grammar: the structure of language; how words sound and work together to communicate

library: a collection of books; a room or building where books are kept

literacy: the ability to read and write; knowledge in a specific area

literature: written works, especially those of high quality and lasting value; printed matter

phonics: a way of teaching people to read by correlating sounds to letters

poetry: writing style focused on concise language that expresses feelings and senses

reading buddies: pairs of different-age readers who share literature and conversation in order to build literacy, communication skills, and relationships

vocabulary: words used in a particular area; the body of words known by a person
