- It is fairness for <u>ALL</u>

 people and working to achieve that fairness.



Diversity

- Diversity makes life more interesting.



Tolerance

- Tolerance is willingness to accept feelings, habits, or beliefs that are different from your own.

Civitas, meaning all citizens are banded together under the same law.

ALL people have rights and are to be protected by the law.



Equality

- It does not mean all people get the same amount of money and resources.
